Catalog Description:

This course covers the basic skill for lifelong participation in bicycling. The course will focus on the fundamentals of cycling, with an emphasis on aerobic training, stretching, safety, and bike maintenance. This course will require the student to perform three days of "on the road" riding which will total 105 miles, beginning and ending each day at the college (Day 1 – 25 miles, Day 2 – 45 miles, Day 3 – 35 miles).

Student needs to provide a bicycle in good, working condition.
