## Hate Crimes

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act requires the reporting of incidents in which prejudice against race, religion, sexual orientation, or ethnicity is employed during the commission of a Group A crime. The Virginia and Eveleth Police Departments have not responded to any Group A crimes in which prejudice was involved in 2002, 2003, or 2004.

## OFFENSE DEFINITIONS

The Jeanne Clery Act requires that statistics be reported for seven (7) Part A crimes, liquor law violations, drug law violations, and illegal weapons violations. The offenses are defined according to the FBI Uniform Crime Reporting/National Incident-Based Reporting System as follows:

**Arson:** To unlawfully and intentionally damage, or attempt to damage, any real or personal property by fire or incendiary device.

**Aggravated Assault:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration or loss of consciousness.

**Burglary:** The unlawful entry into a building or other structure with the intent to commit a felony or a theft.

### Criminal Homicide:

**Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter:** The willful killing of one human being by another.

**Negligent Manslaughter:** The killing of another person through gross negligence.

**Drug/Narcotic:** The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.

**Liquor Law:** The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, or use of alcoholic beverages. Drunkenness and driving under the influence are not included.
